The regular meeting of the Council for the City of Covington was held on Tuesday, March 12, 2019 at 6:30 p.m. in the Council Chambers of City Hall located at 333 W. Locust Street, Covington, Virginia.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Thomas H. Sibold, Jr. The Invocation was given by Rev. Steve Noel followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

# CORRECTION AND APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Upon a motion by Vice Mayor Crosier, seconded by Mr. Tucker, Council voted to approve the following minutes as presented: Work Session of February 5, 2019; Called Meeting of February 5, 2019; Regular Meeting of February 12, 2019; Called Meeting of February 19, 2019; and Called Meeting of February 26, 2019.

#### MONTHLY FINANCIAL REPORT

David Bryant, Director of Finance and HR, gave a power point presentation regarding the FY 2019/2020 Budget. The presentation included an overview of revenues, expenditures, ongoing projects, and future projects/equipment that need to be planned for financially. Mr. Bryant also noted the slow decline in machinery and tools tax. Following the report, a motion was made by Vice Mayor Crosier, seconded by Mr. Hunter, to approve the monthly financial report. Interim City Manager Goodman reminded Council of the budget work session on Tuesday, March 26, 2019 to receive feedback from Council and meet with department heads.

### REQUESTS, PETITIONS, COMMUNICATIONS AND APPOINTMENTS

Upon a motion by Vice Mayor Crosier, seconded by Mr. Tucker, Council voted to add to the agenda, an appointment to the Western Virginia EMS Council.

Discussion was held regarding the HOPE Performance Agreement. Eric Tyree, Director of Development Services, presented information regarding this proposal. The properties on Alleghany Ave. are in need of repair and by working with the HOPE project, the whole community benefits. Work on this project has been ongoing for about 2 years. Interim City Manager Goodman has spoken with Mrs. Wanda Moore regarding this project. Mrs. Moore addressed Council and shared that this project had been her Father's project to get the community together. She expressed appreciation to the Parks and Recreation Department for their assistance in the community. Mrs. Moore requested Council approve the agreement and provide \$30,000 for demolition of the structure. It was noted that if Council approves this agreement, demolition would be contingent upon available funding in the budget July 1, 2019. Following discussion, a motion was made by Mr. Hunter, seconded by Mr. Tucker, to approve the HOPE Performance Agreement contingent upon funding being available. Motion carried 5 to 0. Mr. Goodman noted that if nothing was done on this property in 5 years, it would revert to the City.

Eric Tyree, Director of Development Services, presented information regarding the Lease Agreement with IVO Ltd. in the Drone Center. This is a company that is interested in development. Following discussion, a motion was made by Vice Mayor Crosier, seconded by Mr. Tucker, to approve the Lease Agreement with IVO Ltd. in the Drone Center. Motion carried 5 to 0
