General Description

The City of Covington is accepting applications for full-time position(s) and part-time positions. These positions require Class 1 waterworks certifications and perform skilled work in the operation of the Water Treatment Plant, treating raw water and producing potable water in an efficient and effective manner, as defined by State and Federal guidelines.

Requirements/Preferences

The position requires a Class 1 Waterworks Operators license. Also, possession of a valid Virginia driver's license with a good driving record preferred.

Salary and Benefits

Starting Salary for a licensed full-time Class 1(ONE) waterworks operator will be \$70,000 per year. In a full-time position, the City offers a generous benefits package including health insurance, life insurance, VRS retirement, paid leave and holidays. Following a conditional offer of employment, the successful applicant must pass a physical examination and drug test. Applicants that hold a Class 1 certification are welcome to submit applications for part-time employment as well at a salary based on qualifications.
